### Law Enforcement Liaison Team

#### **Upcoming Trainings**

The Law Enforcement Liaison Team continues their workshop series with their fourth offering in Allegheny County entitled "How to Build a Case-Guide for Investigators." Though previous workshops have focused on collaboration between CYS and Law Enforcement, this educational topic was designed in conjunction with the District Attorney's office specifically to be administered to Law Enforcement only. The first session took place on October 4th and the second will be held on October 25th.

#### **Impact**

Law Enforcement Liaison Ann and Parent Educator Megan S. continue their visits to police departments in Allegheny County to discuss the services our organization offers. Many departments have expressed interest in our agency and are excited to learn about what we offer and how our programs can be a beneficial resource to families in their community.

In September, following a visit to a department and speaking with their chief, both Megan and Ann received calls from officers on the scene with a family in need. Following those conversations, the officers referred the parent/caregiver to the Healthy Parenting Program and scheduled the children for forensic interviews based on the information they gathered on the scene. Megan worked closely with our Intake Coordinator, who then carried on communication with the local police to schedule this case.

This is just one example of how these conversations with police departments provide crucial insight to Law Enforcement on working together as a multidisciplinary team during such instances of suspected child abuse and/or neglect to act on these cases in a swift manner.

## **Healthy Parenting Spotlight**

#### **Allegheny County**

— Parent Educator Megan S. presented at the Magisterial District Judges meeting in Allegheny County about the Healthy Parenting Program. She spoke to a room of 25 judges about how the program can be a resource for the parents and caregivers they see in their court. Megan talked them through the process of who was eligible to refer, how to refer, and how best to manage mandating someone to use our Healthy Parenting Program.

— Groups started up again at Allegheny County Jail, Auberly House of Healing, Passages, and Sojourner House. A Parent Chat also began at Providence Connections.

#### **Beaver County**

- Beaver County Triple P Parent Educators continued groups this month at the Beaver County Jail with a full attendance list of mothers.
- Healthy Parenting Program Manager Jenyne presented Triple P curriculum at Fairview Elementary for another parent night following their enthusiasm for the Kindergarten Readiness presentation they received in September.
- Parents as Teachers (PAT) Parent Educators Shannon and Marlena held the first Group Connection for Beaver PAT at the Beaver Library with parents enrolled in the program. The purpose of these group connections is to offer the parents support and insight from each other and our educators in a group setting.
- Parent Educators Megan, Christine, and Greg attended the Fall Kick Off with the Beaver TIP (Truancy Team) where Megan spoke to the audience about the curriculums offered for Beaver County residents through Healthy Parenting. In attendance were Beaver magistrates, school administrators and counselors from Beaver County school districts.

## **Healthy Parenting Spotlight**

#### **Fayette County**

- Fayette Triple P staff started a group at Good Works Recovery which was well attended, and they are continuing classes at Fayette County Jail.
- Parent Educator Tristan spoke at the IGNITE graduation at Fayette County Jail. This was the second graduation at this facility and the second graduation in the nation with facilities offering the IGNITE program. IGNITE is a rehabilitative program with access to college courses. This was a very special event. Most Fayette staff attended in support and expressed the sweetness of the occasion.
- September's PAT Group Connection was "A PIECE OF CAKE." Parents learned supports that can be used in everyday activities to promote their child's learning and development. While the parents were learning, their kids enjoyed interacting with each other in the new play area. The event also featured a special guest from the Soroptimist, who shared information on programs they offer to families: "Live your Dream and Dream It Be It."



— PAT Parent Educator LeeAnn worked with one of her families to install "Autistic Child Area" signs on their street. She contacted the German Township supervisors and within two weeks the signs were ordered and put up for the family. There are now two placed on each side of their street, covering both their yard and house area.

The family expressed that the signs helped ease their mind that additional precautions were put in place to create a safer environment for their child.
